Peacekeeping School The Alioune Blondin BEYE, through " The Debates of the CARESS " hosted a meeting on August 28, 2020 on the theme: " the actions and contributions of ECOWAS to the resolution of crises in Mali ". This meeting was attended by the High Representative of the African Union, HEM Pierre Bouyoya; the Permanent Representative ECOWAS, HEM Hamady Boly; the Ambassador of Ghana, HEM General Francis Adu Amanfoh; the Chargé d'affaires of the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Mrs. Sarah Bukar-Godwin; many young leaders and influencers of the Malian Civil Society, as well as the auditors of the Master in Peacekeeping and Post-Conflict State Reconstruction.

# **Exchange meeting between ECOWAS and the Malian Civil Society**

The **Director General of the EMP-ABB**, Brigadier General Mody Béréthé took this opportunity to recall the spirit that founded " The Debates of CARESS ", which sets up a framework for dialogue and exchanges between different socio-political actors in Mali on current political, social, cultural and economic issues, in a convivial family atmosphere, and without taboos. He also recalled the links that exist between the Alioune Blondin Peacekeeping School and ECOWAS, the EMP-ABB being one of the three ECOWAS centers of excellence in charge of the training of executives who will contribute to the development of the West African Standby Force, within the framework of the African Union Peace and Security Architecture (APSTA).



With regard to the direct and active involvement of ECOWAS in the resolution of the crisis in Mali, he felt that the EMP-ABB has an important role to play by serving as an entry point and meeting point between national actors and the international community for which ECOWAS serves as the lead organization. This contribution is also ensured by the various services provided by CARESS, through its training and research activities, one of the flagship products of which was produced on the pastoralist / farmer conflict in partnership with NDC and KAIPTC under the leadership of ECOWAS.

He wished to express his special thanks to the Institute for Security Studies (ISS) whose representative in Mali, Mr. Ibrahim Maiga moderated the meeting.

Responding to the various concerns of participants, Ambassador Boly, Permanent Representative of ECOWAS in Mali, recalled that ECOWAS, created in 1975, is one of the most dynamic organizations in Africa. It was created to fight against the balkanization of Africa and to promote the good integration of peoples. To this end, the economic aspects of integration as well as peace and security issues are highlighted in its various policies. Referring to the various conflict management mechanisms of the sub-regional institution, he gave clarifications on the different positions taken by the organization on the current crisis in Mali, explaining the difficulties raised with regard to the different constitutional contexts as well as the measures planned for crisis management within the member states. He stressed that despite the declared measures calling for the establishment of an embargo, many initiatives have been taken to ease the situation, particularly through interventions to allow the passage of food and basic necessities.

As for the representative of the African Union in Mali, Ambassador Bouyoya, who spoke extensively on the Malian crisis, he indicated that the principle of subsidiarity was respected because **the competence of ECOWAS was recognized**. He believes that only Malians should decide on the continuation of the political process which calls for the establishment of a transition. He reiterated the AU's readiness to continue to support the sub-regional effort and to share with Malians the lessons learned in many other countries of the continent, in a spirit of African solution to African problems.

The ambassador of Ghana, HEM General Francis Adu Amanfoh, called for the establishment of a government of national unity and the organization of credible elections. The Chargé d'affaires of Nigeria, Mrs. Sarah Bukar-Godwin, concurred, highlighting the commitment of her country within ECOWAS for a resolution of the crisis in various ways, particularly in support of the mediator, the former president of her country, Goodluck Jonathan.







The young leaders and influencers of the Malian Civil Society participating in the exchange meeting wished that the following messages be relayed by the panelists:

- ECOWAS should be closer to the people and that it should no longer be perceived as an organization that defends the authorities in place, to the detriment of their populations;
- that the issue of extending presidential terms of office in the subregion be given the same attention and response as an unconstitutional change in power, as a conflict prevention measure;
- ECOWAS should effectively take into account issues of good governance in Member States;
- the contribution of ECOWAS to the discussions under way in Mali so that:
- the content of the transition should be known first before setting the term;
- the criteria to be met for a government to be considered as a government of national unity be specified in advance;
- the Malian conception of governance is well defined so that the guidelines are put in place to avoid a return to the previous situation;
- a new generation of politicians should emerge in Mali.
