It also achieved a very positive annual result, with a record **4,473** staff trained in 2023, **37%** of whom were women.

#### Context:

The population continues to be the victim of attacks and violence perpetrated by armed terrorist groups, exacerbating the structural problems already present in Mali.

#### Mali, from rebellions to peace agreements: issues, lessons and population resilience.



On Thursday, December 07, 2023, the Alioune Blondin BEYE School of Peacekeeping in Bamako (EMPABB) invited the general public to the 20th edition of its Book Club, orchestrated by its Center for Analysis and Research of the Sahelo-Saharan Space (CARESS). The event took place at 15:00 GMT in the reading room of the EMPABB Documentation Centre.

The work highlighted during this session was "Mali, from rebellions to peace agreements: issues, lessons and resilience of populations" by Mr. Aly TOUNKARA, lecturer-researcher at the University of Letters and Human Sciences of Bamako, Director of the Center for Security and Strategic Studies in the Sahel.

After a detailed presentation of the book, time was set aside for questions and answers. This gave Club members the opportunity to discuss, comment and contribute to the debate. Interaction with the author offered a unique opportunity to deepen understanding of the themes raised in the book.

The Book Club brought together a diverse range of audiences, from CARESS members and students from various academic institutions, to history and politics enthusiasts. The presence of loyal Club members, mainly researchers, doctoral students and auditors from the CARESS masters program at EMP-ABB, undoubtedly enriched the debates.

The Peacekeeping School highlighted the richness of the exchanges and the discovery of two major works on central themes for contemporary Mali.
