## « SUMMARY SEMINAR OF THE 2nd SEMESTER OF THE MASTER IN ORGANIZED CRIME, TERRORISM AND INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COOPERATION »

On 17 January 2024, the École de Maintien de la Paix Alioune Blondin BEYE (EMP-ABB) in Bamako hosted the summary seminar for the 2nd semester of the Masters in Organized Crime, Terrorism and International Criminal Cooperation (MACOTEC).

The event was attended by eminent figures, lecturers, researchers, experts, analysts in organized crime, terrorism and international cooperation in criminal matters, as well as by the entire audience, who revisited the modules taught and shared their expertise on the theme of "Comprehensive analysis, approaches and mechanisms for combating violent extremism, terrorism and organized crime". The opening ceremony was presided over by the following personalities: Mr Mamadou TESSOUGUE, Minister of Justice and Human Rights, Keeper of the Seals, Mr Abdoul Kassim Ibrahim FOMBA, Minister of Youth and Sports, responsible for Civic Education and Citizen Construction, Mr Seydou DOUMBIA, Head of Cabinet, representing the Minister of Security and Civil Protection, and Colonel Souleymane SANGARE, Director General of EMP-ABB.

#### Context:

Terrorism and organized crime in the Sahel have been on the increase in recent decades. Transnational crime is now one of the most pernicious sources of insecurity and one of the scourges that pose the greatest threat to social peace, personal safety, political stability and the economic, social and cultural development of the countries of the Sahel.

#### Justification:

o deal with these phenomena, EMP-ABB, in partnership with the USJPB, has set up the "MACOTEC" to demonstrate how the fight against organized crime and terrorism must involve international cooperation in criminal matters if it is to be effective.



#### Seminar objectives and targets

The aim of the seminar was to consolidate the various modules taught in the second semester and to present a paper on the theme of "Comprehensive Analysis, Approaches and Mechanisms for Combating Violent Extremism, Terrorism and Organized Crime".

It was aimed primarily at MACOTEC auditors, but was also attended by various students from the following fields.



#### **Seminar development:**

After the inaugural lecture given by Mr Abdoul Kassim Ibrahim FOMBA, Minister for Youth and Sport, Civic responsible for Education Citizen and Construction. MACOTEC's auditors led two panels, each comprising five subthemes, to not only edify the audience but also demonstrate the degree to which the concepts learned had been assimilated.



The following sub-themes were developed under the 1st theme, "Comprehensive analysis of violent extremism, terrorism and organized crime":

- Organized crime and terrorism: current situation and challenges;
- 2. Ethics in the fight against terrorism;
- Respect for human rights and the fight against terrorism and violent extremism: what you need to know?;
- Managing criminal assets in countries with limited resources: challenges and prospects;
- 5. Security transition in the Sahel in the face of terrorism and violent extremism: challenges and prospects.



The second theme, which focused on "Approaches and mechanisms for combating terrorism and organized crime", developed the following subthemes:

- 1. Alliance of Sahel States: challenges, issues and prospects;
- Military cooperation and transnational intelligence in the fight against terrorism and violent extremism in the Sahel: what strategy?;
- 3. The role of CSOs in conflict prevention, management and resolution in the Sahel;
- 4. Understanding the media and the rise of terrorism?;
- 5. The role of negotiation in solving terrorism and crime.





### « ADVOCACY AND TRANSFORMATIONAL LEADERSHIP IN GOVERNANCE»

As part of the "Reinforcement des Capacités des Femmes Vectrices de Changement pour une paix et un développement inclusifs au Mali" (RECAFEVEC) project funded by the Kingdom of Norway, the Alioune Blondin BEYE Peacekeeping School (EMP-ABB) in Bamako was the venue on Monday 29 January 2024 for the launch of a training session on "Advocacy and Transformational Leadership in Governance" (PLTG).

The opening ceremony was attended by a number of prominent figures, including: Mr Sidiki TRAORE, Secretary General of the Ministry for Reconciliation, Peace and National Cohesion, Mr Mandjou SANGHO, Secretary General of the Ministry for the Promotion of Women, Children and the Family, Mr Dieudonné SAGARA, Director of the Cabinet of the Governor of the District of Bamako, and Colonel Souleymane SANGARE, Director General of EMP-ABB.

## **Advocacy and Transformational Leadership in Governance**

#### Context:

Despite commitments to promote gender equality within formal structures of representation and decision-making, women continue to be under-represented in all areas of decision-making. They continue to face significant barriers to accessing the upper echelons of decision-making and organizational power.

#### Justification:

The "Advocacy and Transformational Leadership in Governance" course is intended as a tool for demonstrating the complementary nature of men's and women's leadership, and for providing a new perspective on similarities, since it is always on the basis of the similarity of the sexes that equality is advanced, and never by confining the two sexes to specific characteristics (Badinter, E., in Amar, 1999: 4).



## **Advocacy and Transformational Leadership in Governance**

#### Training objectives and targets

The aim of the course was to build the capacity of actors involved at different levels of governance in advocacy and transformational leadership techniques to further enhance the added value of women in peace, security, development and economic empowerment.

It was aimed at local elected representatives (women and men), women from civil society organisations (CSOs), Defence and Security Forces (FDS) personnel, Regional Directorates for the Promotion of Women, Children and the Family (DRPFEF) and the project's Focal Point in the Governorate.

# Gender dynamics in Africa and Mali / Journey to the heart of BOKO HARAM: investigation into the jihad in sub-Saharan Africa.




On Thursday 25 January 2024, the Alioune Blondin BEYE Peacekeeping School in Bamako (EMPABB) invited the general public to the 21st edition of its Reading Club, organize by its Center for Analysis and Research of the Sahelo-Saharan Space (CARESS). The event took place at 15:00 GMT in the reading room of the EMPABB Documentation Centre.

The works featured during this session were " **Gender dynamics in Africa and Mali** " by Dr Kawélé TOGOLA, lecturer and researcher at the Université des Lettres et des Sciences Humaines de Bamako (ULSHB) and Senior Lecturer at CAMES and the Universities of Mali, and " **Journey to the heart of BOKO HARAM: investigation into the jihad in sub-Saharan Africa** " by Seidik ABBA, journalist and writer, former editor-inchief of Jeune-Afrique, columnist and reporter for Le Monde Afrique, and Mahamadou Lawaly DAN DANO, former Governor of Diffa and founder of the Niger programme Repentir contre Pardon.

After a detailed presentation of the books, time was set aside for questions and answers. This gave Club members the opportunity to discuss, comment and contribute to the debate. Interaction with the authors offered a unique opportunity to deepen understanding of the themes raised in the books.

The Reading Club brought together a diverse range of audiences, from CARESS members and students from various academic institutions to history and politics enthusiasts. The presence of the Club's loyal members, mainly researchers, doctoral students and auditors from the CARESS masters programme at EMP-ABB, undoubtedly enriched the debates.

The Peacekeeping School highlighted the richness of the exchanges and the discovery of two major works on central themes for contemporary Mali.
