To mark International Women's Rights Day, the Alioune Blondin Bèye Peacekeeping School in Bamako (*EMP-ABB*) organized an all-female panel on the theme of "*Women's leadership and innovation : a lever for equality and empowerment*".

The opening ceremony took place on Thursday 06 March 2025 in the EMP-ABB conference room, under the chairmanship of *Mrs DIARRA Djènèba SANOGO*, Minister for the Promotion of Women, Children and the Family (MPFEF), in the presence of Colonel Souleymane SANGARÉ, Managing Director of EMP-ABB, and *Mr Ibrahim TRAORÉ*, representing the Head of the Special Delegation of Commune IV of the District of Bamako.

As usual, EMP-ABB has made the commemoration of this day a major opportunity to highlight the progress made as well as the persistent challenges in terms of gender equality and women's empowerment.



The first part of the discussions was devoted to a panel structured around two themes, namely:

- 'State of play and challenges in the application of national texts and commitments in favour of the rights and empowerment of women and girls in Mali', presented by *Ms Karina CISSE*, expert gender analyst;
- 'Resilience strategies and innovations to meet the challenges of gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls in Mali', presentation by Ms Maïmouna Dioncounda DEMBÉLÉ, specialist in gender equality.





Two former EMP-ABB Masters students then enriched the debates by sharing with the audience the impact of their training on their professional and social careers, as follows:

- Feedback 1: 'How the training received at EMP- ABB strengthened the skills and confidence of the beneficiary women and girls on a personal and professional level', delivered by Ms Thiam Nana DIALLO (auditor of the 1st class of the Master in Organised Crime, Terrorism and International Penal Cooperation);
- Feedback 2: 'Discrimination, stereotyping, limited access to leadership positions: how do Alumni cope? delivered by Ms Maimounatou MOHAMED (MP3).





Finally, two women beneficiaries of the 'Capacity Building for Women Vectors of Change for Inclusive Peace and Development in Mali' (*RECAFEVEC*) project spoke of the project's beneficial impact on women's leadership and income-generating community activities.

## Context

Conflicts in the Sahel region are marked by growing complexity, fuelled by a multitude of factors, including the proliferation of terrorist groups and exacerbated environmental pressures. This persistent instability is generating transnational security challenges, with interconnected threats undermining both regional stability and development efforts.

The persistence of violence, the rise of terrorism and the increase in forced displacement are weakening communities, compromising progress in peace-building and putting considerable pressure on the ability of governments and communities to deal with these crises.

## Objective:

These two workshops were initiated to build national and stakeholder capacity in post-conflict reconstruction and the challenges raised by the climate-peace-development nexus.

### Course of events:

Over five days, the discussions brought together national representatives from Mali, Burkina Faso and Niger, from the Ministries of Foreign Affairs and the Environment, as well as experts in post-conflict reconstruction and development.

The following sessions provided an opportunity for further reflection and the promotion of integrated approaches to meeting the challenges of stability and sustainable development in the Sahel region:

**Workshop 1**: 'Promoting holistic responses for post-conflict reconstruction and development in the Sahel region', focusing on capacity building;

**Workshop 2**: 'Promoting integrated approaches to the nexus of climate, peace and development in the Sahel region, focusing on the interactions between environmental, security and development issues.
