## 41st Edition : « THE WAR OF NARRATIVES IN THE SAHEL »



The Alioune Blondin-BEYE Peacekeeping School, through its Centre for Analysis and Research on the Sahel-Saharan Region (CARESS), organised the 41st edition of its book club on Thursday 22 January 2026 in the CARESS documentation room.

The book presented at this edition was entitled "The War of Narratives in the Sahel" by Mr Abdoul NIANG, journalist and political analyst.

According to the author, certain Western media outlets tend to present events unfolding in the Sahel from angles influenced by geopolitical interests, obscuring the local context and fuelling community frustrations. These narratives have thus contributed to dividing populations, thereby legitimising the presence and influence of terrorist groups within certain communities.

As usual, the question-and-answer session allowed participants to contribute to the discussion and gain a deeper understanding of the book.

For this edition, the book club brought together CARESS members and club members, including researchers, doctoral students and CARESS master's students, as well as the author's parents, friends and supporters, who enriched the discussions with their contributions.


